

1. October 7, 1943: "Destruction of telegraph link along the Grodno-Vilna road in the section between Pirciupie and Tetiance. More than 50 telegraph poles were sawn through, the wires were cut and the insulators broken [35 fighters participated, led by Yitzbak Czuzoj and Aron Aronowicz]."
5. October 29, 1943: "Sabotage operation in the city of Vilna: Four transformers and a mechanical water conveyor were destroyed with the aid of English mines [4 fighters participated, commander not listed]."
14. December 31, 1943: "A train was blown up on the railroad from Vilna to Grodno, near Landwarow station. The engine and twenty-one cars carrying troops were derailed. The train had been on its way from Warsaw to Vilna [6 partisans participated, led by Abba Kovner]."
28. May 10, 1944: "Ambush on the Grodno road in the section between Pirciupie and Zygmunciszki. Two units, 'Avenger' and 'To Victory,' took part. Eleven Germans were killed. Booty captured: 6 rifles, 4 hand-grenades, throwers, and 2 'Degtyarov' machine guns [3 partisans participated, led by Elhanan Magid]."
38. April 7, 1944: "Trains blown up on the Vilna-Lida railroad line. One engine and cars carrying men and supplies were derailed [30 partisans participated, led by Shlomo Brand]."

One of the more successful assaults occurred late in the night of March 7, 1943, when about 600 Soviet (and presumably some Jewish) partisans destroyed a railway bridge crossing the Desna River on the line between Gomel and Bryansk. For several days afterwards, supplies meant for the second Panzer division were disrupted at the precise moment when the German army was preparing to launch a major offensive on Kursk. Still, it must be
